The All Ireland Linguistics Olympiad (AILO) is Ireland's largest Science Olympiad with more than 3,500 participants annually. AILO now has an exciting partnership opportunity for organisations who share our passion for fostering the next generation of talented problem solvers for Ireland. AILO is seeking financial contributions to facilitate the operation and continued success of the Olympiad: from the workshop programme and national rounds to the costs of all-island team participation at the International Linguistics Olympiad (IOL).

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What is AILO?

Established in 2009, the ADAPT All Ireland Linguistics Olympiad (AILO) challenges Second Level students to develop their own strategies for solving complex problems in unfamiliar languages from around the globe. More than 36,000 students have participated in the Olympiad to date.

AILO is run by the Science Foundation Ireland ADAPT Research Centre for AI Driven Digital Content Technology. Problem-solving and language awareness underpin the core disciplines of ADAPT Centre research, which include language technology, artificial intelligence, human-computer interaction, and machine learning.

With one in four schools on the island of Ireland taking part, AILO is fostering the next generation of linguistic problem-solvers for Ireland, thereby helping to address findings from the OECD's 'PISA' study, which stated that Ireland's teens possess only mediocre problem-solving skills.

Each year, 3,500 students across all 32 counties receive sample puzzles and are invited to attend a free nation-wide workshop programme championed

by DEIS schools and led by ADAPT tutors. Students take the preliminary round in their school and 100 students are then invited to the national final each year. This round also selects four students to represent Ireland internationally.

Evaluation findings consistently reveal enhanced problem-solving skills and confidence among participants, as well as a greater propensity to study Computing, Linguistics or related fields at Third Level. AILO is therefore helping to create a strong pipeline of students with crucial skills in logical reasoning, linguistic problem-solving, language awareness and team-working skills.
